



Frequently Asked Questions about the Share the Road Specialty License Plate

Bike Florida and the Florida Bicycle Association collaborate to make the Sunshine State safer and more enjoyable for bike riders of all ages and abilities. The two non-profit organizations each receive funding from sales of the Share the Road specialty license plate. With more than 10,000 Share the Road plates already on Florida roads, your support makes a real impact.

How much goes to the organizations?

\$15 of each specialty plate sale or renewal goes to the organizations. In recent years, the plate has generated about \$167,000 annually for the two organizations' educational efforts. By law, 75 percent must be used for education, training and safety, and up to 25 percent can be used for marketing of the Share the Road concept and plate. The funds aren't used for lobbying.

What does the money fund?

The funds pay for education and awareness programs, bicycle and motorist safety efforts with emphasis on sharing the road, workshops, educational materials and promoting safe bicycling.

How long will it take to receive my plate?

You should have your new plate within two or three weeks. If it is delayed, please call Broward Tag & Title at (954) 317-1769.

Do I have to re-apply every year?

Once you have the plate, your registration will be handled as it normally is, with annual renewals. Also, in Florida, license plates must be changed every ten years.

How much does it cost?

The cost depends on how you order it. Using our third-party service BuyFloridaSpecialtyPlates.com will cost about \$95. If you visit your local Tax collector's office, the fee is \$71.85.

Can I buy the plate no matter where I live?

As long as you are a Florida resident, you can purchase the specialty plate either in person at your local tax collector or through our form through BuyFloridaSpecialtyPlates.com.
